A Message from the Bishop



As I write this we are about one month away from our Diocesan Synod. Spring creeps up on us and as the land around us begins to change, snow melts and returns yet the green is slow to return.

I am very much aware that we as a Diocese will have to make more changes if we are to survive. The reality is that even with all the changes we have made we are still spending more than we are bringing in.

As Bishop of Yukon it is my job to ensure that the people of this Diocese receive the pastoral care they need to grow in the will and love of God and become the people God intends us to be. Over the past years we have seen several improvements which has brought a wider range of ministry reaching more people. Our locally raised and trained ministry continues to be an important part of our Diocesan family. The Ministry of Presence has enabled three parishes to continue and grow.

This summer will see the Anglican Council of Indigenous Peoples come to provide leadership training, reaching out to not only the First Nations of our Diocese but to all. A team of people from Ontario will be coming up to share their ministry in the Diocese. I see growth in our Diocese but there is room for much more.

At our Diocesan Synod there will be reports on how to best provide training through the Bishop's School. A committee has been struck and over the last year has been looking at changing our structure as a Diocese to see how we can best provide pastoral care to our people with the resources that we have.

Change is something that we will all have to accept as a sign of growth. Our Lord calls us to service. Our Lord calls us through the Holy Spirit to become the people he wants us to be. That means change, that will mean sacrifice for us all. If we walk in the way of the Lord, He will walk by our side. If we ask Him, He will lead us. In this journey with Jesus may we walk together in His service and for his glory and may we make room for Iesus to lead us. May God bless and keep you.
